OPERATION PAPERCLIP TACTICAL CAMP ANDERSON
FEBRUARY 1945

As the German Reich is collapsing and the Allies enter Greater Germany we can expect that they will fight with greater tenacity to protect their homeland. This weekend s battle will be furious.

Schedule:

FRIDAY:

1500 - 2300 Registration, pick up hit card, assemble and set camp. A black market will be held outside the canteen for troops to barter or sell goods.

Barracks are available 20 dollars per night. Camping is permitted.

2400 Lights out tactical silence.

SATURDAY:

0600 - 0800 Registration and chow available in the mess hall. 8 dollars per meal, served by Camp Anderson staff.

0800- 1600 Fight on, we are tactical.

Scenario:

The Axis will be in tactical positions and will also have roving squads. Some Axis units will be evacuating and guarding crates of important documents. These will be

large heavy wooden crates of technical papers, weapon, rocket and aircraft blueprints. These are important scientific papers and have a high priority to Allied Intelligence.

Intelligence believes that there are three large document caches. These are Allied objectives. The German troops will prevent their capture by any means including moving them if capture is imminent. A major cache is believed to be in the German HQ.

German objectives will be to avoid capture of the documents, ambush and eliminate Allied patrols and the priority capture of allied fuel, medical supplies and communications. German field police will also be attempting to apprehend and execute any German deserters.
